Adopter requirements

- Make a 15-20 year commitment to their new cat or kitten.
- Cats and kittens must be kept indoors (except supervised on a leash).
- Live in an apartment or house that accepts pets.
- No one in the home has pet allergies or asthma.
- Provide all proper future care for their cat or kitten.
- **Kittens 5 months old or younger are adopted out in pairs/multiples** unless another suitable kitten or young cat is already in the home. Research has shown that this is healthiest for you and your kitten and is the policy of many no-kill shelters.

Adoption Fees

Adoption fees are based on our cost of caring for one cat or kitten for one week.

- \$80 Adult cat (over 1 year old)
- \$100 for young cats (5 months to 1 year)
- \$150 for one kitten (5 months old or younger;
with other kitten or appropriate cat in home)
- \$255 for two kittens (5 months old or younger)

What is included in the adoption

- Felv and/or FIV testing, Initial vaccinations, spaying or neutering, wormings and microchipping
- A free vet exam through Dr. Obegi
- 10% off cat supplies (not including food) for the life of your cat or kitten
- A free 3.5 lb bag of Nutro Natural Choice cat or kitten food
- Frontline flea treatment at time of adoption
- A 2 week health guarantee (conditional on care)

Adoption fees are payable by cash or check (No bankcards please). All adoption fees go directly to support the rescue.

About our Cats and Kittens

We receive our kitties primarily from owner surrenders as well as from “kill-shelters” that would otherwise euthanize them. We never purchase cats or kittens. By adopting from us you are saving lives.

All of our rescue cats and kittens are screened for feline leukemia and other health problems. They go through an initial 7 day quarantine period and are treated for fleas (Frontline) and worms (Pyrantel and Panacur) and any other medical conditions. They receive their first vaccinations and an Avid microchip as permanent identification. All cats and kittens are spayed or neutered before leaving our rescue.

How to find cats and kittens to adopt

Most of our adult cats and some kittens and young cats are listed on Petfinder.com, and we have many cats and kittens on premises everyday. We try to keep Biographies of each cat on each enclosure. If we haven't posted it yet please just ask staff about any kitty you are interested in.

Many of our cats, especially kittens, are being cared for in one of our many foster homes. These are brought into the store for adoption Saturday 11-6 and Sunday Noon to 4:30 or by appointment.

Holds

We do accept holds, but only when you are 99% sure that it is the one you want (one hold per person please, unless you plan to adopt multiple cats or kittens). Hold period is one day for a kitten and two days for a cat.
